Liberation

26 And as they led him away, they seized one Simon of Cyrene, who was coming in from the country, and laid on him the cross, to carry it behind Jesus.



27 And there followed him a great multitude of the people and of women who were mourning and lamenting for him.



28 But turning to them Jesus said, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me, but weep for yourselves and for your children.

35 And the people stood by, watching, but the rulers scoffed at him, saying, "He saved others; let him save himself, if he is the Christ of God, his Chosen One!"

36 The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine



37 and saying, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!"



38 There was also an inscription over him, "This is the King of the Jews."



39 One of the criminals who were hanged railed at him, saying, "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us!"



40 But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation?



41 And we indeed justly, for we are receiving the due reward of our deeds; but this man has done nothing wrong."

42 And he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." 43 And he said to him, "Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in paradise."

Big Idea: Jesus' death and resurrection represent the ultimate liberation for you.

Here's how Jesus' death on the cross and his resurrection can totally liberate you:

The cross will liberate you <u>from</u> sin.
The cross will liberate you <u>from</u> death.
The cross will liberate you <u>from</u> bondage.
The cross will liberate you <u>to</u> new life.

The cross liberates you from sin.

38 Let it be known to you therefore, brothers, that through this man forgiveness of sins is proclaimed to you, 39 and by him everyone who believes is freed from everything from which you could not be freed by the law of Moses.
